Better World Day 2023!

On May 5th, GCCS-Flour City Campus took part in an EL network-wide event called Better World Day! This an annual, national event where El Education encourages students to take action to contribute to a better world. Hundreds of EL schools across the nation took part in it and shared their stories on social media.

The Flour City students had a special assembly to learn about what other EL schools were doing for the event, and then learned about our school-wide activities that were planned for the day to kick off our first ever Better World Day event. Students learned about one of our "neighbors" at the Colgate-Divinity Complex, Hope Lodge. Students learned that Hope Lodge provides a free home away from home for cancer patients and their caregivers who are seeking care in Rochester but live more than 40 miles away from the city. Then students went back to their classrooms to spend time making cards for the patients that stay at the Lodge. After that, each class collaborated to plant flower pots that will help beautify the entrance of Hope Lodge. It was certainly a heart-warming day at Flour City!!

Director's Message

Dear Flour City Campus Community,



I'd like to begin by apologizing for how late this newsletter is. As a new leader of a brand new school I'm learning how to balance my new responsibilities with my personal responsibilities. I appreciate your patience as I learn to navigate this new professional life.

With that said, no matter what role I have played in my career in education, the end of a school year naturally leads me to reflect on my performance, capacity, and goals. This year is no different. I recognize many areas in which I need to improve as a leader, and I am committed to growing as a leader of Flour City. As an EL Education school, and a part of the GCCS growing network, there are many tools we have in place to evaluate not only my performance, but also the quality of the education we are providing your children. I'd like to share some results/feedback that we've received thus far from these sources.

All EL Education schools go through a mid-year and end of year implementation review. Teachers and leaders complete extensive surveys to gather information about *Curriculum, Instruction, Culture & Climate, Student-Engaged Assessment,* and *Leadership* and how we align in these areas with EL Education principles. After the survey responses are compiled, EL provides us with a score with some feedback. As a first year EL school we require a score of 47, and our score for year one was 74. Some feedback we received indicated that we could improve in lesson delivery, student-engaged assessment (students evaluating themselves), and building a culture of crew (sense of community in the classroom). We are committed to growing in these areas as we look ahead to next year.

We also had our first year visit from SUNY (our authorizers) on May 26th. They spent the entire day here and had a lot of positive feedback to share! They made it clear that our school does not look like a first year charter school and instead seems well-established. Some other strengths they pointed out was our ability to meet SEL needs of students and families, creating a positive staff culture focused on improvement, and creating an authentic space for the entire school community. This was great to hear, and I know the staff was looking forward to the visit so we could share the school we are so proud of!

These evaluations, in conjunction with student results from iReady and other benchmark assessments, family surveys, and student focus groups will help guide our decisions about professional development next school year! So, we appreciate any feedback you can provide in the surveys we send. And please know, we are committed to growing as professionals and a school community!




Family Culture & Climate Survey Results



In total we received 40 responses to the surveys. Here is how families responded:


Please check 1-2 that best apply to your family's identified race and/or ethnicity:




The Top 3 Most Effective Ways You Receive Information




How satisfied are you with the following forms of communication?




Please check all school-wide events your family participates in



What are some barriers to you getting more involved or attending school-wide events?




I feel comfortable communicating with...




The school values my opinion and my child's needs


My child's race/ethnicity/background is valued at GCCS-Flour City




This school sets high standards for academic success for all students.




I have other families I am connected to in the school community.




When I have a school-related question or need, I know who I can ask to get a helpful answer.




When I have concerns about my child's social-emotional or academic needs. I know who to reach out to.

Passage Ceremony - June 28th at 10:00am

Our very first Passage Ceremony will be on June 28th at 10:00am. This is a long-standing annual tradition at GCCS and we plan to carry on that tradition at Flour City! Each class will be performing for the school community so students have been hard at work practicing and rehearsing their songs and dances in their arts classes!

On this day, students will be dismissed at 11:45. Therefore, after passage ceremony you are welcome to take your child home with you. Any students that travel back to the school with us will be dismissed to busses or caregivers shortly after we arrive back at school. We will be sending out a survey about 2 weeks before passage to determine how many students will need transportation on these days so that we can communicate our needs with the transportation departments.
