4. Executive Director Update: Facilities & Enrollment Updates, Campus Updates

Beth shared updates on the following topics:

- <u>Facilities Updates:</u>
 - New sign is up and looking great
 - Fire door work has been completed

Data Updates:

- Enrollment: Flour is at 155 enrolled students, a little high in each classroom but is on track with target enrollment numbers (and both in Students with Disabilities & ELL for a total of ~11%).
- Attendance & Absenteeism: rates were shared for the Flour City Campus and currently attendance is at 92% with a chronic absenteeism rate of 20%.
- Suspensions: none at this point in the year.

• Campus Updates:

- o Primary project Coming to GCCS at RMSC and Flour City Campus
- o EL National Conference; Accepted for National Presentation
- o RMSC Partnering: 5th grade class to field test an exhibition for the Museum
- 6th Grade Retreat: They're off!
- Christine shared that Senator Samra Brouk visited the campus today! Two fourth graders toured around with Christine as she showed them the school. Highlight of the visit was 2nd and 4th grade classrooms sharing what they have been learning about—erosion, four corners protocol. Each classroom had a student ambassador to welcome her—her feedback was positive and that it was a really authentic, student centered visit.
- ROC Crews: multi-grade crews with 8-9 students in each one with one adult. They met for the first time today and the first lesson was about responsibility and it was really magical to see it come to life. ROC Crews meet once a month.

6. Committee Updates - Colin Orr

a. Finance Committee - Maria Oliver

We have received the \$200K grant we have been waiting on for the last 2 years—this will be put back into paying off some of our outstanding loans. Flour's enrollment looks okay and no concerns about needing to complete a budget amendment. The Committee is keeping an eye on spending and on cash flow for both campuses.

- c. Personnel: Focus Group Update; ED Search Update, Harper Hewes Contract Colin Orr

The search committee met for the first time last week and it was a productive meeting—reviewing the job description, norms for their work and more.

Committee met a couple weeks ago and made their charter, established the calendar for the year, is still working on their Statement on Diversity and updating the organization chart for both schools. The Committee approved and discussed the next steps in the contract for the Talent

Consultant to help with the Executive Director Search and the committee has presented a proposal from Debra Harper with Harper Hewes. Colin had reached out to Debbie (as a family friend and knowing she does this kind of work) and she expressed interest in supporting our search with her work. She is a local consultant and has a more flexible fee structure that includes a baseline of hours, and any extra work that we determine the search needs will be charged hourly and billed bi-weekly.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Trustees hereby approves the Plan of Merger by three-quarters majority vote of attendees at this meeting; and

RESOLVED, the Board of Trustees authorizes and directs Board Chair to execute the Plan of Merger, Certificate of Merger, Verification, and any other documents necessary to effectuate the merger; and authorizes and directs the Board Secretary to execute the Verification.
